He completed his academic certification with the European Boards in Pediatric Surgery and Transplantation, Master's Degree in Medical Direction and Clinical Management from the UNED (2007-2009), and Master in Health Center Management OBS Busssiness School and UAB (2018-2019). He has specialized in research in clinical and experimental transplantation with several research projects (CAM, FIS, and FMM).

He has also extensive participation in research networks: member of the SAMID network (RETIC), member of the European network for intestinal transplantation research NITE, and member of the executive committee of the European reference network ERN-TRANAPLASNTCHILD, dedicated to the pediatric solid and hematopoietic organ transplantation, and the only one of these coordinated networks from a Spanish center.

Finally, he treasures an intense collaboration with patient associations dedicated to intestinal failure and transplantation (NUPA) including charitable and scientific outreach activities.
