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Samuel Kocoshis, MD, specializes in intestinal rehabilitation as well as the management of complex intestinal and liver disease at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center. Within the Gastroenterology, Hepatology, and Nutrition Division, Dr. Kocoshis is the medical director of the Small Intestinal Transplantation Program and for many years had led the intestinal rehabilitation research currently focuses upon promotion of the intestinal adaptation following massive small intestinal resection as well as biomarkers for acute cellular rejection following intestinal transplantation. Prior to joining Cincinnati Children's, Dr. Kocoshis was chief of Pediatrics Gastroenterology and co-director of the Intestinal Care Center of Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh, and professor of pediatrics at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine. Dr. Kocoshis earned his bachelor's degree from DePauw University and his medical degree from the Medical College of Wisconsin. He completed an internship in pediatrics at the West Virginia University Medical Center; a residency in pediatrics at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh; and a clinical fellowship in gastroenterology at Yale University School of Medicine.

Dr. Kocoshis has been an active member of numerous national committees and advisory boards. He has authored and co-authored 175 peer-reviewed articles, review articles and textbook chapters.



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
