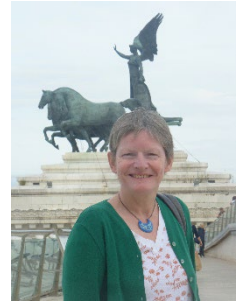

I am a paediatrician, trained in the most beautiful city in the world (Paris !), and for a fellowship in Paediatric Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Nutrition, in Montreal, Canada. Back in Paris, I established the unit of paediatric hepatology and liver transplantation in Necker-Enfants malades in 1992. The institution was already well known for its intestinal rehabilitation unit, and for the first world intestinal transplantation performed in 1987, and after a difficult start, a program developed from 1994. I became responsible for children after combined liver-small bowel transplantation, and later on for those after isolated small bowel transplantation. We organized, with the friends of the Network for Intestinal failure and Transplantation in Europe (NITE), four European workshops on intestinal transplantation in children. I sat on the Council of ESPGHAN (European Society for Paediatric Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Nutrition) and ITA (Intestinal Transplant Association), and am currently chairperson of the Young Investigator Forum (YIF) of ESPGHAN. Together with George Mazariegos, and the Council of ITA, we organized the ITA meeting in Paris in July 2019 (a success, as I heard !). I was sad not to discover New Zealand during CIRTA-COVID, but am ready to fully enjoy beautiful Chicago (lake, architecture, blues ... and also CIRTA meeting !).
