Cécile Lambe, MD, is a pediatric gastro-enterologist specializing in pediatric intestinal failure and nutrition. She works at Hôpital Necker-Enfants Malades in Paris, and teaches nutrition at Université Paris Cité. After her training in Pediatrics with a fellowship in general pediatrics and infectious diseases, she joined the Necker pediatric gastro-enterology team in 2008. She set up the hospital nutritional support team and in 2013 she took over the intestinal failure rehabilitation center looking after children on home parenteral nutrition. She developed several concepts to improve the care of children with intestinal failure: taurolidine locks to prevent catheter infections, plasma citrulline variation as a predictive factor for short bowel adaptation and conducted the recent GLP-2 analogue 48-week trial. Fully involved in gut physiology and diseases, her expertise in the mechanisms, genetics and consequences of intestinal failure has grown naturally. She is also involved with the Laboratory of Intestinal Immunity, INSERM, UMR1163, at Imagine Institute in Paris. She is a member of ESPGHAN and Chair for the ERNICA (EuRoPean Network for Inherited Congenital Anomalies) intestinal failure group.



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
