Dr. Logan is a Pediatric Psychologist in the Pediatric Transplant Center at Boston Children's Hospital. She is a Member of the Faculty in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Harvard Medical School. In 2013, she earned her PhD in Developmental-Clinical Psychology, completing dual training in developmental and clinical psychology. She went on to complete pre-doctoral internship and post-doctoral fellowship training at Nemours/A.I. duPont Hospital for Children in Wilmington, Delaware, joining the faculty in 2014. She went on to serve as a Pediatric Psychologist within the Hillman Center for Pediatric Transplantation/UPMC Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh and Clinical Assistant Professor of Surgery at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine from 2015-2020. From 2018-2020, she served as the co-chair of the Patient and Family Voice arm of the Starzl Network for Excellence in Pediatric Transplantation, a multi-center learning network aimed at improving pediatric liver transplant outcomes through innovative and collaborative patient-centered approaches. Her clinical and research interests include developing and adapting systemic approaches to accelerate the identification of patient and family psychosocial risk factors to reduce morbidity among solid organ transplant recipients, as well as long-term psychological health and adjustment in children and families with chronic illness.



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
