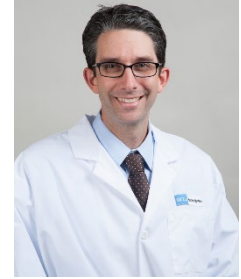

Dr. Robert Venick is a Professor of Pediatrics and Surgery at the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA. He graduated cum laude from Duke University prior to attending medical school at University of Southern California. Dr. Venick completed his pediatric residency as well as his fellowship in Pediatric GI/Nutrition and Hepatology at UCLA. He is board certified in pediatric gastroenterology and transplant hepatology, has been on faculty at UCLA for over fifteen years and serves as Director of Pediatric Liver Transplantation and Pediatric and Adult Intestinal Rehabilitation and Transplantation Services at UCLA. Dr. Venick has received funding from the National Institute of Health and the American Society of Transplantation for his research in intestinal failure associated liver disease, auto-immune hepatitis, pharmacogenomics, PTLD and post-transplant medication adherence. He has held leadership roles in the International Liver Transplant Society and North American Society for Pediatric Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Nutrition. He chairs the scientific committee of the Intestinal Rehabilitation and Transplant Association, and helps manage the International Intestinal Transplant Registry. He has authored nearly one hundred peer-reviewed publications as well as several book chapters.



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
