Dr. Rodrigo Vianna is the Director of Transplant Services and the Director of Liver and GI Transplantation at the Miami Transplant Institute. He is also a Professor of Clinical Surgery at the University Of Miami Miller School Of Medicine. Prior to this, he was the Director of Intestinal/Multivisceral Transplant at Indiana University. Under Rodrigo's direction, the Intestinal and Multivisceral Transplant Program became the largest and most successful program in the world. Dr. Vianna also decreased liver transplant operative times by more than 50% with the majority of patients not requiring blood transfusion during the surgery.

Under Dr. Vianna's leadership, the liver transplant program has the best one year patient and graft survival in Florida since his arrival in Miami (SRTR data) and during his tenure, MTI has become the largest and most comprehensive transplant program in the United States.

Dr. Vianna's interests lie in immunosuppression-related complications such as Epstein-Barr virus infection and post-transplant lymphoproliferative disorder. He has numerous peer reviewed journal articles to his name and he frequently lectures at national and international meetings.
