Yannick Wouters, M.D., Ph.D., is a driven post-doctoral researcher and compassionate gastroenterologist-intraining from the Netherlands. After successfully completing his Master's in Medicine in 2013, dr. Wouters embarked on a professional career blending scientific research with clinical practice. He obtained his Ph.D. in 2020 under the guidance of dr. Geert Wanten, head of the intestinal failure unit at the Radboud University Medical Center in Nijmegen. Dr. Wouters' research focused primarily on maintaining venous access in patients on home parenteral nutrition, by employing translational and clinical studies. He has explored several topics, ranging from the prevention of bloodstream infections through the use of catheter lock solutions, to development of an innovative diagnostic test for rapid broad-spectrum detection of bloodstream infections, and genetic and clinical risk factors for the development of candidemia. Dr. Wouters has been awarded several awards for his scientific work, including the Nutrishare HomePN Research Prize from The Oley Foundation in 2017, 2018, and 2019, and several grants from ZonMw and the MLDS.

From 2018 onward, dr. Wouters is in training at the Maastricht University Medical Center to become a gastroenterologist, simultaneously conducting research and supervising his Ph.D. student, Dr. Veerle Gillis.
